V. Employee Pension Contribution Adjustments

1. Contributions Owed to the Employee

Fleeting, Marlene

Amount Due: \$ 12,493.50
Interest Due: 1,015.23

Reason: When Ms. Fleeting transferred from the state CMERS plan in 2005, she elected to take a refund of her contributions from CMERS. In 2005 she was set up in the pre-2003 HMEA plan with a 7.8% pension contribution rate, but she should have been set up in the post-2003 HMEA plan with a 5% pension contribution rate because she did not transfer her CMERS service to the MERF.

Faircloth, Robert

Amount Due: \$ 2,385.89
Interest Due: 41.61

Reason: When Mr. Faircloth was hired in 2010 he was set up in the pre-2003 CHPEA plan with a 6.5% pension contribution rate, but he should have been set up in the post-2003 CHPEA plan with a 5% pension contribution rate.

2. Contribution Adjustments

The new Police contract allowed current police officers to elect to be covered under a new retiree medical insurance plan and the post-1999 police could elect to be covered under the new post-2012 police plan. If either of these elections were made additional employee pension contributions would apply. When payroll changed the pension contribution codes in the payroll system to reflect these new elections some of the new codes were not set up properly. For some of the police officers either too much or too little was deducted. Attachment A shows the police officers who are due a refund or need to pay additional employee pension contributions. During the audit the Pension Unit also found several police who needed additional adjustments. Several officers had incorrect pension contributions deducted for several years and several other police officers owed pension contributions on Workers' Compensation.
